Dr. Volkan is an Emeritus Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Virginia, Charlottesville, Virginia, an Emeritus Training and Supervising Analyst at the Washington Psychoanalytic Institute, Washington, DC., and the Senior Erik Erikson Scholar at the Austen Riggs Center in Stockbridge, Massachusetts. He holds Honorary Doctoral Degrees from Kuopio University, Finland (2005) and from Ankara University, Turkey (2006). He was a past president of the International Society of Political Psychology (ISPP), the Virginia Psychoanalytic Society, the Turkish-American Neuropsychiatric Society, and the President of the American College of Psychoanalysts.

He has served on the editorial boards of 16 professional journals including *the Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association*, authored or co-authored of 40 books and was the editor or co-editor of 10 more. He has published more than 400 scientific papers or book chapters. His work has been translated into many languages.

He was the founder and director of the Center for the Study of Mind and Human Interaction (CSMHI) at the University of Virginia: ([www.healthsystem.virginia.edu/internet/csmhi/](http://www.healthsystem.virginia.edu/internet/csmhi/))

In the 1990s, Dr. Volkan served as a member of the Carter Center's International Negotiation Network, headed by former president Jimmy Carter. In 1995, he chaired a Select Advisory Commission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI's) Critical Incident Response Group. In 2000, he served as an Inaugural Rabin Fellow at The Yitzhak Rabin Center for Israeli Studies in Tel Aviv. In February 2001, he was a visiting professor of Law at Harvard University in Boston, Massachusetts. In 2002 he was a visiting professor of psychiatry at Ege University, Izmir, Turkey. In 2006 he was a visiting professor of psychiatry at the University of Ankara, Turkey. During the same year he was the Fulbright/Sigmund-Freud-Privatstiftung Visiting Scholar of Psychoanalysis and Visiting Professor of Political Science at the institute of Political Science, University of Vienna, Austria. In 2007 he was a visiting professor of psychiatry at Cerrahpaşa Medical School (Istanbul University) and a visiting professor of political psychology at Bahçeşehir University, Istanbul, Turkey.

In 2003, he received the Sigmund Freud Award given by the city of Vienna in collaboration with the World Council of Psychotherapy.

Dr. Volkan was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008 for examining conflicts between opposing large groups, carrying out projects in various troubled spots in the world for 30 years, and developing psychopolitical theories. Currently he, with Lord John Alderdice, Robi Friedman and with Edward Shapiro and Gerard Fromm from *the Austen Riggs Center*, is involved in bringing together representatives from the Western and Islamic worlds to examine the existing perceptions and feelings concerning the so-called Western-Islamic world split.
